## THE BLACKSTONE REPORT



- Study conducted in 2018
- The average age of the flooring installer in North America is 56.
- > The industry loses 5,000 6,000 flooring installers per year.
- A shortage of floor covering installers has characterized the floor covering industry for several decades. In the absence of a concerted industry effort to change the situation, the shortage is likely to continue."

# FACTORS CONTRIBUTING TO **TRADE LABOR** SHORTAGE

- > The removal of "shop class" in most high schools in the US
  - High schools began being judged on "college preparedness" instead of "job readiness".
- Societal pressure that college was the only ticket to a better life.
- Tradespeople stopped passing down their craft.
  - "I want more for my kid". When, in reality, what they had wasn't all that bad!

The current floor covering installation community as well as retailers and suppliers will also play into our strategy as we will utilize this network to share our message.





## FLOORING SPECIALTIES

There are four primary types of flooring. You can learn them all, but most installers specialize in one or two product categories since there are unique skills needed for each.

Softness, warmth, comfort. and affordability make carpet a popular choice for many homeowners. Carpet installers measures and calculate how to best fit pieces of carpet in the space. They prepare the subfloor, install a cushion layer and skillfully seam together different sections of carpet creating a beautifully finished floor.



Solid hardwood floors (made from solid pieces of wood) and engineered hardwood floors (made from layers of wood) are the two primary types of hardwood flooring-For pre-finished hardwood, flooring installers glue or nail down floors making sure to keep boards lined up and tight. Sometimes floors are installed unfinished, sanded, and nished for a custom floor.

## /inyl/Resilient

There are many types of vinyl flooring, but they have similar installation techniques allowing a craftsman to master them all. Sheet vinyl comes in rolls like carpet. It is then cut to fit a space and glued down. Much of today's installed vinyl, however. is luxury vinyl tile (LVT) and luxury vinyl plank (LVP). These planks and tiles mimic the look of wood, stone, or tile.

Tile is used in flooring but also for kitchen backsplashes, walls, and showers. Tile can be mixed, matched, and installed in different ways to create drastically different looks. Tile

craftsmen are artists that put their skills to practical use. Basic tile installation includes preparing the surface, cutting the tile, spreading a layer of mortar to adhere the tiles to the surface, and finally grouting the set tiles.
